Introduction

This booklet provides information about all the courses available at Hampton Senior High School for students in Year 10, 2026. Please read it carefully, so that informed choices are made. If you would like more detailed information about a particular course, please do not hesitate to contact the relevant teacher or Head of Learning Area.

Electives are **semester-based courses** and are studied for 2 periods per week. This is to provide students with the flexibility to study a wide breadth of subjects. Alternatively, students who would like to focus on a particular course can do so by electing to study a course over two semesters.

For example: If you would like to study Recreation General for both semesters you must select both 10RECGA and 10RECGB.

Students will be completing a compulsory elective in Semester 1: Careers and Pathway Planning. As a result, students will select:

Students studying Gifted and Talented Dance, Specialist Performing Arts (Drama), and Athletics Academy must read closely the specific information provided regarding course selection.

Academic Standards Plan

Year 9 and 10 students are encouraged to achieve C grades or above to support a successful transition into Senior School and should begin planning their future pathway. Students enrolled in Extension courses must achieve a B grade or higher to select the corresponding ATAR course in Year 11. As Year 11 course selections are based on Semester 1 Year 10 results, these grades will be used for initial selections; however, students who achieve a B grade by the end of Semester 2 may have their ATAR course selection reconsidered. Exceptions may apply for students with diagnosed learning disabilities or other exceptional circumstances, with individual cases considered on their merits.

Course Selection via Subject Selections Online (SSO)

Students can access the Senior School Handbook on Compass and are encouraged to discuss course options with their families before completing selections.

Secondary Assistance Scheme – Applications open Term 1, 2027, closing Friday, 9 April

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs, each year.

To be eligible for the allowance, the parent/guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The card needs to be valid during Term One of the new school year.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance, paid directly to the parent/guardian or transferable to the school
- \$235 Education Program Allowance, paid directly to the school

The Arts

Gifted and Talented Dance (Semester 1 & 2)

Cost: \$110

HoLA: Sascha Bragaglia Program Coordinator: Caitlin Stone

Students are pre-selected for this course in Year 6 with additional opportunities to audition in Years 8 and 10 for the following year. Please see the GAT Dance Coordinator if you are interested in applying.

Students study Contemporary dance in the areas of technique, improvisation and performance, with an emphasis on the development of composition. The theoretical focus is on dance analysis and Australian contemporary dance companies. Students are also provided with the opportunity to develop skills in Hip Hop, Jazz and Contemporary dance.

Specialist Performing Arts (Drama) (Semester 1 & 2)

Cost: \$100

HoLA: Sascha Bragaglia Program Coordinator: John Bartuccio

This course focuses on play building, playwriting and the structure of drama. Theatre history and style along with written skills are a focus in this course. One period a week is dedicated to language and vocabulary development, response writing and research skills. Students will learn backstage basics such as lighting, set design, costume, make up and dramaturgy.

Specialist Cheer Dance (Semester 1 & 2)

Cost: \$180

HoLA: Sascha Bragaglia Program Coordinator: Zoe Flint

Students continuing in Specialist Cheer Dance will be expected to make an after-school commitment by attending additional period(s) each week. Throughout the course, students will gain the knowledge and understanding of how to perform a group stunt routine as well as build the confidence to choreograph their own short dance.

Media and Visual Arts Electives

Photography – Digital Art

Semester 1 10PHOA Cost \$40

This course will develop your technical photography skills while you learn how to sell a product and follow a design brief. Students will also learn a range of lighting skills for studio photography.

Photography – Youth in Focus

Semester 2 10PHOTT Cost \$40

This course investigates the use of photography in media, focusing on texts that are aimed at young audiences, for example: magazines, album covers, blogs and fashion photography. Through the production of your version of these texts, you will learn how youth culture is represented in the media.

Visual Art – Creative Experiences

Semester 1 10VARA Cost \$50

This course is for students who want to develop their artistic skills and techniques and for those who are interested in a future in art and design. Students delve into a range of inquiry artworks to create a portfolio that explores the styles and techniques of artists from the past and the present. These experiences lead to the development of an original designs for final resolved artworks that incorporate a wide range of techniques, both 2D and 3D, within the Visual Arts. This course is a very 'hands-on' experience that teaches you many creative arts skills in a fun and relaxing environment.

Visual Art – Creative Practice

Semester 2 10VARB Cost \$50

This course is for students keen on expanding their artistic horizons in both 2D and 3D realms and for those wanting to gain experience in the process of artistic practice. In their creative inquiry, there will be a focus on developing personal concepts and individual styles. They will practice skills in composing, refining and reflecting upon their creative processes. They will investigate a variety of artists and movements that will inform their designs and enrich their knowledge of Visual Art. Presentation practices are also considered as they participate in exhibiting their art works to public.

Media - Television Genre**Semester 1 10MEDA Cost \$40**

This unit is recommended for students who are passionate about television, whether it is broadcast or streamed through the internet. Students will learn what it takes to produce a television episode and how to create audience-grabbing media online. Students will extend their filmmaking techniques by exploring special effects and titling, learn about time and space manipulation techniques and effective storytelling. This unit will introduce theory and practical skills that will provide a solid foundation for Media in Year 11 and 12.

Media - Reality**Semester 2 10MEDDF Cost \$40**

This semester-long unit introduces students to the exciting ways in which reality is shaped by journalistic filmmaking and reality television. As a budding filmmaker you will learn production techniques with an emphasis on cinematography and editing. Your theory will revolve around codes, conventions and the ethics of non-fiction media. You will analyse the choices made by film makers that shape the truth and manipulate the beliefs of their audience. You will create productions that experiment with film language and techniques while producing news segments and reality television.

Performing Arts Electives**Contemporary Dance****Semester 1 10DANA Cost \$25**

This course has a higher focus on analysis and more challenging practical tasks in preparation for continued study in Year 11 and 12. Students will learn Contemporary Dance technique, improvisation, and performance with an emphasis on composition development. Dancers will be provided with a range of optional performance opportunities throughout the year. This unit will further develop your skills with Hampton's Dance staff and specialist tutors.

Commercial Dance**Semester 2 10DANB Cost \$25**

Through participation in this course, students will be given the opportunity to develop physically, creatively and artistically. Students will work on confidence, clarity of movement and projection. Dancers will have the option to create their own choreography, look at current trends in dance both onstage and online, and develop technical skills in Commercial Jazz and/or Hip-Hop genres. New to dance and ready for some fun, fitness and a photoshoot? Then this is the course for you!

Youth Theatre**Semester 1 10DRAA Cost \$25**

Students bring scripts to life through acting, directing, design and production. Through performance, voice, movement and character development, students build confidence and creativity while exploring theatre-making and storytelling. Opportunities may include working with industry professionals, attending performances and presenting work to a live audience.

Devised Drama**Semester 2 10DRAMB Cost \$25**

Students develop skills in acting, improvisation, scriptwriting, characterisation and theatre production. Through performance and collaboration, students explore a range of theatre styles, work in onstage and backstage roles, and may have opportunities to perform for live audiences and engage with industry professionals.

The course prepares students for senior school General Physical Education, exploring theoretical content such as functional anatomy, biomechanics, exercise physiology, and motor learning and coaching. Students will apply that theory through hands-on investigations, practical skill development, and game play. A genuine curiosity about how the body moves and responds to physical activity will be an asset in this course.

Recreation General

Semester 1

10RECGA

Cost \$65

Semester 2

The course prepares students for worthwhile use of leisure time. It provides students with the opportunity to acquire skills and knowledge in the recreational pursuits. Students will participate in school-based sports such as Badminton, Indoor Soccer, Handball, Frisbee, Floorball, Softcrosse and Flag-belt Rugby. Students will also be attending multiple excursions throughout the year possibly participating in sports at the following facilities: Altone Sports complex, Morley Ten Pin Bowling & Squash world in Mirrabooka.

Recreation Fitness

Semester 1

10RECFA

Cost \$65

Semester 2

Cost \$65

The course will see students engaged in a series of Fitness testing scenarios both at the pool and in the gym. Detailed records will be kept and an improvement in ratings will be expected by the end of the semester. A genuine desire to understand the Principles of Fitness and to improve fitness levels through regular, vigorous exercise will be required. Activities will include speed and distance swimming, cross country running, power walking and aerobics/circuit training sessions, and cardiovascular bias games with opportunities to engage in aerobically demanding team sports.

Digital Technologies Electives

Hands on hardware

Semester 1

10BTA

Cost \$50

You will study Hardware and software essentials before you,

- install basic hardware components, peripheral devices and software,
- learn simple strategies to maintain personal security on devices,
- create a simple database and complex spreadsheets for good user experience,
- create a range of business documents including forms for data collection,
- learn the importance of Intellectual property and effects of cyber-crime on individuals and business.

This course aims to give students everyday practical skills which can be useful at home. It lays a sound foundation for progression to a Certificate II in Applied Digital Technologies or Certificate II Workplace Skills in Year 11 and Certificate III Business or Certificate II Creative Industries in Year 12.

Cyber Security

Semester 2

10CSB

Cost \$50

With the world so connected with the internet, data protection has become a huge concern for governments, businesses and individuals. Technology has many benefits, but it is also used by criminals, very effectively. Careers in cyber-security and data management are growing to meet these threats and concerns. You will begin with a Cyber Hunt, continue with Cryptography and learn how to avoid being scammed! Investigate cybercrime statistics and its impact on the Australian economy and explore careers in Cyber-security.

Drones and Industry

Semester 1

10DIA

Cost \$50

The focus of this course is on drone technology and its applications in industry. Students will learn about safety and operational constraints before operating a drone to accomplish a range of challenges. You will create a video presentation showcasing the way drones are changing many industries and predict how they can impact your future. You will create an instructional video presentation and showcase the way drones are changing many industries and predict how they can impact your future. Possible areas of research include the use of drones in agribusiness, surveillance, tourism. You will also create a video about the use of drones in industry.

Virtual Reality

Semester 2

10VRB

Cost \$50

Virtual reality is becoming more commonly used for training and entertainment in today's world. Whether you are training as a surgeon, a paramedic, a firefighter or home designer, 3D technologies make learning real, without the cost. Explore the impacts of Virtual reality use as individuals and for business.

You will learn to use VR headsets and VR apps to create your own virtual experience at a simple level. It may involve some coding and understanding of the digital systems used for virtual reality.

Design and Technologies Electives

Woodwork

Semester 1

10DTWWA

Cost \$65

Semester 2

10DTWWB

Cost \$65

Students work with different types of wood, other materials and fixings. The focus of the course is for each student to design and manufacture their own product in response to a design brief. Students will be trained in the workshop to use a variety of hand tools and machinery to support the production of their projects. Students can develop and practise skills that contribute to creating a physical working product, while acquiring the knowledge and understanding of the design process. Students will learn effective methods in which to research existing products, how to develop their own ideas by learning various drawing techniques and effective time management to create their own designs. Students may need to purchase additional materials for higher-cost projects.

Mechanical Engineering

Semester 1 10DTME Cost \$65

This course is designed as an entry level course. Mechanical engineering involves the design of systems which involve motion. Students will explore the basics of forces, energy transfer and simple machines and their application in more complex mechanical systems. This will require students to explore a variety of machines and use skills in mathematics, science, and technologies in an engineering project. Students will develop an understanding of how motion is used in various applications, including but not limited to vehicles and other mechanical systems. This course aims to provide students with a solid foundation on moving components and how they are applied in mechanical systems.

Engineering with Metals

Semester 1 10DTEMA Cost \$65
Semester 2 10DTEMB Cost \$65

Students will work with different metals and machinery to produce a range of products designed by them. They will have the opportunity to learn industry useful skills with a focus on numeracy. The course draws on and expands transferable skills developed in Year 9 Metals and introduces students to the manipulation of metals using a wide range of tools, processes, materials and systems. Some new skills developed in this course may include folding sheet metal, oxy-acetylene welding, MIG welding, machining, drilling, grinding and polishing of a range of metals. As part of industry skills students will also learn to design, cost projects and assess risks through Occupational Health and Safety Skills development.

Clothing Fashion and Textiles

Semester 1 10TEXA Cost \$60

This is a practical based course with students sewing a variety of items that will develop student's skills in the use of textiles. Some of the practical projects include the production of garments such as a hoodie, skirt or upcycle fashion and other textiles into products such as bags and other home décor products. Students are required to supply fabric and project-specific notions (e.g. zippers and buttons).

Fashion & Textiles Technology

Semester 2 10TEXB Cost \$60

This is a practical based course that provides students with the opportunity to explore the history of fashion and fashion trends. Students develop their sewing skills to create a garment and other textile products. Opportunity to develop your fashion design skills through possible collaborations with other departments to create wearable fashion.

Child Studies

Semester 1 10CFBCA Cost \$55
Semester 2 10CFBCB Cost \$55

Students will learn about contraception, conception, pregnancy, and birth; the development of a child; meeting physical needs of babies and children through a range of practical activities. Students will develop an awareness of the responsibilities of parenting and explore the stages of child development from 0 to 5 years. Students will be exposed to a range of guest speakers including new mothers and simulations. Some practical activities may include toys, room decorations and meal for babies and children. Students will host a Hampton Playgroup for 0–4-year-olds and the families using the knowledge and skills developed throughout the course.

Foods of the World

Semester 1 10FOODA Cost \$75

Join us on a culinary adventure and take your taste buds on a 'Tour of Taste' from all corners of the world. Students will travel the world looking at many different cultures through research and food. Students will have the opportunity to research the traditions of one cultural food and their celebrations of their choice, plan and prepare a feast of dishes. Students must bring food containers as required.

Café Club

Semester 2 10FOODB Cost \$75

Students will learn the 'cafe culture' of bistro service. Students will learn food safety practices to compliment food service, preparation techniques and presentations. A multi-focused program, students will analyse, prepare, and serve a variety of coffee and match complimentary flavours via the use of café foods. Students are required to bring food containers as needed and participate in Period 0 (7:30–8:30am) or Period 6 (2:47–3:45pm) activities as a compulsory component of the course.

Mathematics

Extending Mathematics Through Real World Concepts

Semester 1

10MRWA

Cost \$40

Semester 2

10MRWB

Cost \$40

To enrich the compulsory syllabus taught in Years 9 and 10 by providing students opportunities to reason, problem solve and work cooperatively towards real world project-based outcomes. A strong emphasis will be placed upon providing contextual learning opportunities to strengthen the skills and concepts needed to succeed in ATAR Mathematics. Participation is highly recommended for students placed in the 10A program. The Option v10 WA syllabus skills and concepts taught in Year 10A will be aligned to this program.

Mathematics Pathway
