Introduction

This booklet provides information about all the courses available at Hampton Senior High School for students in Year 9, 2026. Please read it carefully, so that informed choices are made. If you would like more detailed information about a particular course, please do not hesitate to contact the relevant teacher or Head of Learning Area.

Electives are **semester-based courses** and are studied for 2 periods per week. This is to provide students with the flexibility to study a wide breadth of subjects. Alternatively, students who would like to focus on a particular course can do so by electing to study a course over two semesters.

For example: If you would like to study Recreation General for both semesters you must select both 9RECGA and 9RECGB.

Students will be completing a compulsory elective in Semester 2: Careers and Pathway Planning. As a result, students will select:

Students studying Gifted and Talented Dance, Specialist Performing Arts (Drama), and Athletics Academy must read closely the specific information provided regarding course selection.

Academic Standards Plan

Year 9 and 10 students are encouraged to achieve C grades or above to support a successful transition into Senior School and should begin planning their future pathway. Students enrolled in Extension courses must achieve a B grade or higher to select the corresponding ATAR course in Year 11. As Year 11 course selections are based on Semester 1 Year 10 results, these grades will be used for initial selections; however, students who achieve a B grade by the end of Semester 2 may have their ATAR course selection reconsidered. Exceptions may apply for students with diagnosed learning disabilities or other exceptional circumstances, with individual cases considered on their merits.

Course Selection via Subject Selections Online (SSO)

Students can access the Senior School Handbook on Compass and are encouraged to discuss course options with their families before completing selections.

SSO opens Thursday, 30 July 2026.

2. Final confirmation

- Once online selections are made, the Finance Officer will contact families to confirm approval and arrange payment of the required deposit.

Secondary Assistance Scheme – Applications open Term 1, 2027, closing Friday, 9 April

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs, each year.

To be eligible for the allowance, the parent/guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The card needs to be valid during Term One of the new school year.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance, paid directly to the parent/guardian or transferable to the school
- \$235 Education Program Allowance, paid directly to the school

The Arts

Gifted and Talented Dance (Semester 1 & 2)

Cost: \$110

HoLA: Sascha Bragaglia

Program Coordinator: Caitlin Stone

Students are pre-selected for this course in Year 6 with additional opportunities to audition in Years 8 and 10 for the following year. Please see the GAT Dance Coordinator if you are interested in applying.

Students study Contemporary dance in the areas of technique, improvisation and performance, with an emphasis on the development of composition. The theoretical focus is on dance analysis and Australian contemporary dance companies. Students are also provided with the opportunity to develop skills in Hip Hop, Jazz and Contemporary dance.

Specialist Performing Arts (Drama) (Semester 1 & 2)

Cost: \$100

Program Coordinator: John Bartuccio

This course focuses on play building, playwriting and the structure of drama. Theatre history and style along with written skills are a focus in this course. One period a week is dedicated to language and vocabulary development, response writing and research skills. Students will learn backstage basics such as lighting, set design, costume, make up and dramaturgy.

Specialist Cheer Dance (Semester 1 & 2)

Students continuing in Specialist Cheer Dance will be expected to make an after-school commitment by attending additional period(s) each week. Throughout the course, students will gain the knowledge and understanding of how to perform a group stunt routine as well as build the confidence to choreograph their own short dance.

Media and Visual Arts

Media – Film Genre

Semester 1

9MPAA

Cost \$40

In this course you will explore and experiment with the conventions and features of the world's most popular film genres. You will study a wide range of genres, unpacking the stereotypes and story devices that feature prominently in popular cinema. Students will begin to master the art of cinematography and editing, while expanding their creativity in the areas of scriptwriting and problem solving.

Media – Television Advertising

Semester 2

9MPAB

Cost \$40

In this course you will develop your understanding of the techniques used in television advertisements to persuade you to buy or engage with a product. Through studying a wide range of television advertisements and producing your own, you will gain an insight into some of the tricks of the advertising trade. Students will expand upon their production skills in the areas of lighting, motion graphics and special effects.

Photography – Composition & Design

Semester 1

9PHOA

Cost \$40

In this course you will gain an understanding of the rules of composition and media codes and conventions, that make for good photography. There will be many opportunities to apply your photographic skills to demonstrate your knowledge of these principles.

Photography – Portraiture & Print Media

Semester 2

9PHOB

Cost \$40

This course looks at the many and varied applications of photography in print media, including newspaper, magazines and display advertisements. You will develop your skills in portrait photography and learn how images are manipulated to convey meaning.

Visual Art – Creative Inquiry**Semester 1****9VARA****Cost \$40**

In this course we offer engaging creative tasks in a relaxed environment. Students gain a broad skill set using diverse materials and techniques to produce both 2D and 3D artworks. Over the semester, a folio of creative inquiry tasks assists in designing and producing two final resolved artworks. The students make connections to art movements and artists throughout the course, which enriches their understanding of artistic practice.

Visual Art – Creative Explorations**Semester 2****9VARB****Cost \$40**

In this course, students explore diverse art movements and styles from the past and the present. Over the semester a variety of folio tasks are completed, exploring both 2D and 3D art forms. This process assists the students to design and produce two final resolved artworks. The projects set in this course, emphasise hands-on exploration and continued development of creative arts skills.

Performing Arts Electives**Devised Drama****Semester 1****9DRAMA****Cost \$25**

Students develop skills in acting, improvisation, scriptwriting, characterisation and theatre production. Through performance and collaboration, students explore a range of theatre styles, work in onstage and backstage roles, and may have opportunities to perform for live audiences and engage with industry professionals.

Producing Powerful Theatre Production**Semester 2****9DRAMB****Cost \$25**

Students will be given opportunities to refine their knowledge and skills to present drama as an event, by safely using processes, techniques, and conventions of drama. Students will bring the Dark Ages, Australian Bush Rangers or Interstellar Sci-Fi story to life. You will learn to create and mix genres like comedy and drama and appreciate the fun in the world of Melodrama. This style provides the students with a less confronting stage experience as the characters from Melodrama are much easier to perform for live audiences. Students will have the option of participating in a range of productions whilst learning to work in a team of backstage and onstage roles.

Making Moovz (Contemporary Dance)**Semester 1****9DANA****Cost \$25**

This course will develop intermediate dance techniques including turns, kicks, dynamic combinations, leaps and travelling patterns, while increasing your fitness, flexibility, and strength. Students will develop skills in a range of genres including Jazz, Contemporary and Hip Hop. Dancers will be given opportunities to choreograph using the elements of dance (BEST) and learn about choreographic devices and structures to develop choreographic intent. Students will be provided with optional performance opportunities and enjoy an excursion to a live dance performance!

Everybody Dance Now (Commercial Dance)**Semester 2****9DANB****Cost \$25**

This course will increase your fitness, flexibility and strength whilst exploring dance throughout history. Students will investigate popular dance styles from all around the world and build their confidence and teamwork skills. Dancers will have the option to create their own choreography in a range of popular genres whilst considering costume, lighting and staging. New to dance and ready for some fun, fitness and a photoshoot? Then this is the course for you!

The course prepares students for worthwhile use of leisure time. It provides students with the opportunity to acquire skills and knowledge in the recreational pursuits such as Badminton, Indoor Soccer, Basketball extension, Handball, Frisbee, Floorball, Softcrosse and Flag-belt Rugby. Students will also be attending multiple excursions throughout the year possibly participating in sports at the following facilities: Altone Sports complex, Morley Ten Pin Bowling & Squash world in Mirrabooka.

Recreation Fitness

Semester 1

The course will see students engaged in a series of Fitness testing scenarios both at the pool and in the gym. Detailed records will be kept and an improvement in ratings will be expected by the end of the semester. A genuine desire to understand the Principles of Fitness and to improve fitness levels through regular, vigorous exercise will be required. Activities will include speed and distance swimming, cross country running, power walking, aerobics/circuit training sessions and cardiovascular bias games with opportunities to engage in aerobically demanding team sports.

Smart Technologies

Semester 1

9HTEC

Cost \$55

A 'smart technology' is one which can be remotely controlled, often via the internet. Home security, air conditioning, voice activated lighting and garden watering systems to name a few. Create your own intelligent home system using simple hands-on kits to program some of these functions. You will learn basic security measures to secure your home network and safeguard against online threats such as phishing and scams. [Cost includes one Microbit per student \$36.00. Additional Microbit cost \$36.00]

Game Design

Semester 2

9GDES

Cost \$50

Game designers usually work in teams, but each member needs to understand all aspects of the process. You will learn design and planning techniques leading to creating a digital game. This will require an understanding of User Experience, User Interface and the Target Market to make your game a success. You will learn about ethical principles related to Intellectual Property so that you can protect your rights as a game developer.

Robotics

Semester 1

9ROBA

Cost \$50

Robotics is one aspect of AI (artificial intelligence) and you will develop your skills with designing, building and programming a robot. You will challenge each other in a Battle of the bots and then prepare for a robot soccer match! You will work collaboratively to design, build and program a robot for competition.

Programming

Semester 2

9PROGB

Cost \$50

The focus of this course is coding (Python). Data is almost the MOST valued commodity in the world today. Managing, interpreting and using data effectively is essential to every business. You will create simple databases and complex spreadsheet functions; commonly used in business. You will widen your programming skills and learn the basics of Python. You will have an opportunity to showcase their games to others at the school level and/or at the Game Changer competition.

Design and Technologies Electives

Clothing and Textiles

Semester 1

9TEXA

Cost \$65

Students studying Clothing and textiles use the process and production skills which encourages them to investigate, plan, produce and evaluate a range of practical projects. This course develops sewing skills and techniques using a variety of specialist equipment and students are guided to construct simple garments such as pyjama pants and other textiles projects for themselves. Students are required to supply fabric and project-specific notions (e.g. zippers and buttons).

Creativity with Clothing

Semester 2

9TEXB

Cost \$65

This practical subject provides students with opportunity to understand and implement process and production skills using textiles as a material. Students use the concept of upcycling and commercial patterns to complete a unique outfit for themselves. Students use design briefs to research, design, make and evaluate textiles products and a design portfolio accompanies each project. Students are required to supply fabric and project-specific notions (e.g. zippers and buttons).

About Babies and Myself

Semester 1	9ABCA	Cost \$65
Semester 2	9ABCB	Cost \$65

About Babies and Myself will give the students the opportunity to learn the safety requirements in the home as part of the role of babysitting for young children. Students will interact with local primary schools to create soft toys and games to meet the learning development needs of this age group. About Myself allows students to understand the importance of self-image, respect and how to look after each other with the responsible use of social media. Students will use sustainable practices to create practical self-care products.

Ready, Steady, Let's Cook

Semester 1	9FOODA	Cost \$70
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This semester-long course will give students the opportunity to develop their culinary skills and techniques to prepare a variety of dishes that are delicious. The students develop practical cooking skills preparing interesting and tasty meals while learning about why people choose the food they eat. Students will learn the different food groups and the effect each food has on the body. This is a hand-on, practical course that promotes the development of independence, working collaboratively and allows students to develop confidence in the kitchen.

Cook 4 You

Semester 2	9FOODB	Cost \$70
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This semester-long course aims to further develop students' practical skills through cooking delicious, healthy meals while learning about current social issues surrounding food. Students will learn to analyse personal food intake, interpret food labels, and understand health effects of fast foods and convenience foods. Students learn about food safety and preparation while working both independently and in a team.

Woodwork

Semester 1	9WWA	Cost \$65
Semester 2	9WWB	Cost \$65

Students design and manufacture a product in response to a design brief while developing skills in planning, research, technical drawing and workshop safety. Using hand and machine tools, students work with timber and other materials to create quality projects while strengthening problem-solving, time management and numeracy skills, including accurate measuring.

Engineering with Metals

Semester 1	9EMA	Cost \$65
Semester 2	9EMB	Cost \$65

This course introduces students to the manipulation of metals using a wide range of hand tools, machinery, processes, materials and systems. Some new processes to be developed will include, but not be limited to, fuel gas and electric welding processes, machining, fitting, drilling, grinding and polishing of a range of metals. Some of the work will require design and planning using the Technology Process with literacy and numeracy skills consolidated in practical applications such as quantity and cost estimations. Health and Safety aspects will be taught and reinforced at all times. Students will learn how to conduct a risk assessment and job safety analysis in a range of industrial settings.

Electronic Engineering

Semester 1	9EEA	Cost \$65
Semester 2	9EEB	Cost \$65

This course provides students with an introduction to the electrical trade field. Students develop knowledge of electrical theory and principles as well as construct electrical circuits, installation, solder electronic circuits and use test equipment. Students are required to think logically to problem solve independently. It is suited to those who wish to work with the latest in computer technology, software, control systems, building automation, audio-visual technology and electronic components and appliances.
